Living Together



Equality Matters





The Year 8 students concluded their Term 1 Global Connections studies by presenting research findings around gender inequality. After delving into ten causes of gender inequality, students selected the five most significant, explained their choices and discussed potential solutions. In this presentation, Deetthea elaborated on how job type segregation and education are two of the more pressing causes of gender inequality today. Everyone in the class presented their thoughts with evidence and the presentations ended with a fruitful discussion around future directions of solving this issue.

Year 8 Mandarin



Year 8 students have learnt to apply "sensory writing" techniques in their Mandarin essays. Writers employ the five senses to engage the readers' interest. When you want to describe a past event, try to relate on what you saw, heard, touched, smelled, and tasted, then incorporate that into your writing. Year 8 students have practised "sensory writing" technique by describing an event given.

Year 10 students watched the fable story on video and subsequently answered the comprehension question in order to deepen their impression and have a self check about their understanding of the idiom.
