


Social Learning

Emma bought 2 candies. One costs 27 cents and the other costs 50 cents. How much change from 1 dollar does she receive?

One way we incorporated collaborative activities in an online setting is through breakout rooms. Year 3 students were grouped and assigned to create word problems involving measurement in separate breakout rooms. As the students brainstormed their ideas in their respective breakout sessions, the teacher switched between the sessions to facilitate discussion and offer feedback. After about 15 minutes, students were gathered in the main meeting room and the groups challenged each other with their word problems.
