Year 8 Global Connections

Currently Year 10 students in Economics are completing Unit 29 - Economic Growth, Part of the unit covers the topic 'Business Cycle'. One of the tasks given to students to further understand the business cycle was, to research on countries which went through the different stages of the business cycle. Here are some of the findings.

Slump

A slump refers to a period of poor performance or inactivity in an economy. It is said to be at the bottom of a recession in the trade cycle. During a slump, there will be high unemployment while consumption, investments and net export earnings will be low. There is many business failures and consumers have low confidence to borrow and spend. Government spending increases during this period to aid the economy to recover from the recession.



Due to the outbreak of Covid-19, Japan suffers its biggest economic slump on record. The country fell into recession in early 2020 after two successive quarters of economic contraction. The country's GDP fell 7.8% from the previous guarter in April-June. The data for the April-June guarter shows the biggest decline since comparable figures became available in 1980. One of the main factors for the slump was a severe decrease in domestic consumption. Exports have also fallen as the global trade was affected by the pandemic. The latest data is the third successive guarter of declines for the Japanese economy, representing its worst performance since 1955.
