Principal's Message

Our emphasis on developing students' confident literacy skills continues. With students returning to the campus this week, the focus for our professional development session was the development of strategies to enable students to collaborate whilst maintaining physical distancing. Extensive research demonstrates that speaking and listening activities stretch the potential for thinking. In our training we considered ways to use pair-work effectively and discussion structures such as add-develop-challenge. Teachers planned how to apply such strategies and I will be visiting lessons to evaluate the constructive use of collaborative activities.

During the week ahead, literacy will be at the forefront of our minds as we hold our English Week at school. In our assembly on Monday we will introduce activities, with a variety of literacy challenges taking place. One activity will be to 'guess the reader' as teachers wear book-character masks to read extracts from books and students try to guess who the reader is. Every day, during Book Week, we will start the day as usual with our 'Drop Everything And Read' sessions but we will also schedule these reading bursts at various other times during the school day. These will be signalled by blowing a whistle. Therefore, it is important that students spend some time choosing a book to bring to school that they will find interesting and enjoyable. On Friday, we are inviting students to wear a Book Character mask and there will be prizes for the best creations. To preserve safety, the character mask should be worn over the usual surgical mask!


Saving the World

In Year 4 Maths, the children studied 3D shape and geometry. In these photos, you can see how children have explored and used nets, in order to create different and interesting 3D shapes.









Teaching Together
