






RETIREMENT RESEARCH

Year 3 students researched the retirement ages of different countries around the world for a task in the IPC unit: The Generation Game. Students also used the Internet to find out what some elderly "celebrities" like Joe Biden, Jackie Chan, and Hayao Miyazaki can contribute to society even at old age



Getting Moving



We are doing vigorous warm up activities in PE classes to start our lessons. This increases the temperature and flexibility of your muscles, and helps you be more efficient and safer during your workout. A warm-up before moderate- or vigorous-intensity aerobic activity allows a gradual increase in heart rate and breathing at the start of the activity. It also helps to make us feel motivated together!







Heartbeat of Learning

Year 5's current topic is Fit For Life. Students have learned how to find and measure their pulse rates. Students learned to find their pulse rate by pressing two fingers onto the wrist or by the artery in their neck to feel their pulse. They also learned to calculate their pulse rate and measured it by beats per minute. They know now how everyone's pulse rate is different and how the pulse rate shows how strong their hearts are.







Heartbeat of Learning

Year 5 learners also had the opportunity to learn about different exercises around the world. Through their research and preparations for a presentation, they learned about the different ways people around the world exercise. Recently, they had a focused activity with a balloon to learn how simple actions affect their pulse rate. They also provided their observations of any changes to the body when at rest and after an activity.



SCIENCE SOLUTIONS

Today during Science we did an experiment with litmus paper and universal indicator. We used items like lemons, oranges, salt, sugar and toothpaste. I put salt into a beaker and added 5 ml of water and started stirring it with a stirrer. I took a piece of litmus paper and placed it into the mixture. It took some time but it didn't change colour because it was a neutral solution. I poured some of the solution into the test tube and put a drop of universal indicator and it turned reddish orange.
