

Space between particles: Small Particles arrangmovementement: Very close Particles: Vibrate in a fixed position


Liquid

OUTLAWED - WHY DEATH PENALTY SHOULD BE OUTLAWED?

- We all want a criminal justice system that's sensible, effective, and creates a safe society with less crime.
- Evidence shows that the death penalty has no impact on public safety.
 Stats from the Death Penalty Information Center indicate that in the past forty years, there have been 1,184 executions in the South compared to just four in the Northeast, and yet homicide figures in 2015 were nearly 70 percent higher in the Southern states.
- By abolishing the death penalty, we could focus our time, energy and resources on supporting victims and families harmed by violence.
- It can't be undone if new evidence is revealed.
 - Even if they aren't all innocent, a deeper dive into their cases could reveal discrimination, inadequate representation, and other issues that would prove they didn't receive a fair trial.





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
STEM Challenge

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






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Fountain flowing without Electricity -Engineering Design

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IT Virtual Workshop


Calling all Form 4 and 5,
